The South African Research Chair in Community, Adult and Worker Education and the Centre for Education Rights and Transformation in the Faculty of Education invites you to a public seminar presented by **Jeanne Bouyat**.

Title: Researching institutional xenophobia at school in South Africa.

ABSTRACT: My dissertation explores how xenophobia in post-apartheid South Africa is reflected, amplified and attenuated at school – with a focus on secondary schools located in four low-income areas in Johannesburg (Soweto, Alexandra, Denver and Yeoville); the inner-workings of state administrations and organisations advocating for immigrants’ educational rights. This presentation focuses on dimensions of “institutional xenophobia” which I argue are prominent in the South African schooling system. I will discuss barriers to access services and jobs, everyday othering, and pedagogy.



BIO: Jeanne Bouyat is a postdoc at CERT (UJ) and invited researcher at the French Institute of South Africa. She holds a PhD in political science from Sciences Po, Paris, France.

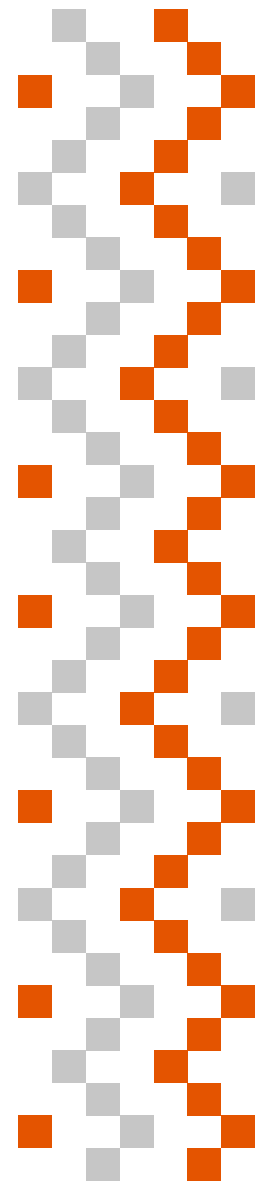
